Shepherd ordering bags for the Australian Highlanders. Richard teaches piping full time with the St. Andrews College Pipe Band in NZ as well as being p/m of grade 1 Canterbury Caledonian Pipe Band. He is also a well known soloist and travels to Scotland to play in the top competitions. We are also pleased that he found the time to select his top three tunes - see below.

George Shepherd was formerly p/m with the Clan Gregor Pipe Band in Scotland and a relation of the famous Shepherd bagpipe making company from Fife - he has recently moved to Australia. Both bands are making the long and somewhat costly trip to the World Championships this year in Glasgow Green and we wish them great success.

Top Tip - Chanter Reed Strength

When buying a pipe reed, pick one that is in your comfort zone for strength. You are looking for one perhaps slightly harder than you might blow but not a lot - there is no fun in playing a reed that is too hard for you. Yes, you get more volume and oomph but you'll also get a hernia or the like! If the reed chokes i.e. cuts out a little, then it's a sure sign it's too hard. To begin with, it may be harder than you are comfortable with but this should ease after a few plays. Try to ease the new reed in gradually and keep using the easier old reed at the same time. Your drones may also stop with the new reed but again don't have a knee jerk reaction and alter your drone reeds until your new reed settles a bit - i.e. in the first week. Remember the new reed will also be flatter to begin with and therefore your drones will tune higher up - i.e. 1/2 inch.



The Top Tunes Selection - by P/M Richard Hawke

1. Lament for the Children - since I first heard this piobaireachd and knowing the story behind it, this tune in my mind absolutely highlights the power of the music of the highland bagpipe. It's a tune that you would never tire from listening to or playing.
2. John MacColl's March to Kilbowie Cottage - a classic 2/4 march that I have always enjoyed playing.
3. The Masons Apron - again another classic tune that had an instant impact the first time I heard it and a tune that is still being regularly played as a fun tune with all its variations. Always a crowd pleaser.

Richard Hawke is one of New Zealand's most successful pipers, having won the Highland Piping Society of London Gold Medal (Oban), the Braemar Gold (twice) and Silver Medal (twice), and the Dunvegan Gold Medal. Within pipe bands, Richard has gained 4 National New Zealand Grade 1 championships, and 9th in

the Grade 1 world championships. He is currently pipe band director of St Andrew's College Pipe Band and the Canterbury Caledonian Pipe Band.

This is a relatively new bagpipe made by McCallums in Kilmarnock- approx 5 years old. It's from their clasp collection, with silver mounted into **REAL** ivory mounts –hall marked silver slides and silver ferrules in a thistle design. It has a wooden McCallum chanter and silver sole as well as a bag-piper case. It would normally retail in the region of £3,500-4,000 but as Begg Bagpipes approaches our 30th birthday, I am prepared to consider any reasonable offer to let this pipe go to a good home.
