Top Tip

It is of interest to note how many players use a <u>split stock</u> today - they are very common and we are supplying a lot. Strangely enough, they have been around for a while and previously didn't take off - that's piping for you. The other item in the same category which is worth mentioning is the <u>trap dri</u>, which is quite simple but works well in conjunction with the water tube trap. It's fitted in the middle of the tube and effectively acts as a double moisture trap. Please get in touch if you would like some more information or clarification on the split stock and trap dri.
