# Interesting Piping Folk - P/M W. Cochrane

During the recent Piping Live!, I managed to catch up with my old friend Wille Cochrane.

He may not be hugely well known in his homeland of Scotland- from Castle Douglas, Dumfries - but there can be few people in the past 60 years who have been more greatly involved and inspirational in the piping world than Willie. Affectionately known as WC, he is at home in every country he finds himself in and probably has piped in more countries than anyone else. He has been a full time player all his life after he branched out from his army career as P/M of The Kings Own Scottish Borderers to set up a world wide network of players that would play at various events - rugby, football galas,



cruise ships, all sorts of festivals and so on. He formed the Balmoral Highlanders who are professional teams of Scottish entertainers with many years of experience as Pipers, Drummers and Dancers. Tours have included Japan, Italy, Norway, U.S.A., Germany, Bahamas, France, Canada and Switzerland to name but a few. The Balmoral Highlanders played in the film "Amazing Grace" and "Tea with Mussolini" directed by Franco Zeferelli. Willie has toured with Paul McCartney playing Mull of Kintyre and also guested with Rod Stewart and the Bee Gees.

Having achieved so much over a long career, he never-the-less is still performing from his base in Edmonton, North London. He has played for kings, queens, presidents and even Idi Amin - he was held captive I think in the 70s in Uganda in a big political incident. I suspect it was because Idi Amin loved Scotland and just wanted one more tune from Willie before he left the country! He has in my opinion promoted not just himself with charisma, professionalism and charm but has done a great deal as an Ambassador to promote piping and Scotland world-wide - a bigger unheralded star you will not come across. What a great life he has had, doing something he enjoys so much. Another most interesting, great guy and one who I have the pleasure to call a close friend.

At this level, the players are all heroes in my book, the concentration required, the pressure on all of them, and the standard of their instruments never ceases to amaze me..... (There SHOULD be folk queuing down the street to hear them!)

Jamie Forrester, in particular, has a confident commanding presence when playing, and held back his March, The Braes of Brecklett, beautifully when playing, and with perfect deportment...this is striking as, of course, a piper is also an actor, to a degree, as well as a skilled musician.

I was cheered to see and hear "THE MASTER"! Stuart Liddell (in my humble opinion, the present "King" of the G.H.B. in all its forms...)

Being particularly keen on acoustics, and the BIG sound, I would love to hear these players competing in a great cathedral one day...to hear these great instruments in a BIG space .....stone or wood floors ....and mega - HIGH ceilings!.....at a military event, I once heard "Lochaber no More"...in a huge cathedral...never forgotten.....sound "unleashed.".....!.
